1. THE STRATEGIC OPPORTUNITY

Colombia and Israel are entering a new phase of strategic dialogue and cooperation. Both nations possess complementary strengths that can create a long-term partnership focused on resilience, innovation, sustainability and territorial transformation.

The White Paper “**Colombia-Israel 2035**” proposes a 10-year cooperation framework built on a simple principle:

Colombia brings territory, biodiversity, agricultural potential and strategic geography. Israel brings technological innovation, applied research and proven experience in resilience-driven solutions.

Colombia contributes

Exceptional biodiversity and territorial resources

Agricultural capacity and global export potential

Strategic position between two oceans and proximity to major markets

A market of more than 50 million people and regional connectivity

Israel contributes

Technological innovation and applied R&D

Ag-tech, water management and precision agriculture

Cybersecurity, critical infrastructure protection and crisis management

A recognized startup and innovation ecosystem

Led by **Tierras de Montaña (TDM)**, the initiative proposes a territorial demonstration model combining regenerative agriculture, climate infrastructure, digital traceability and strategic cooperation.



2. REDEFINING SECURITY: FOUR STRATEGIC PILLARS

The Colombia–Israel partnership can redefine security beyond traditional defense, focusing on the foundations that determine national resilience.



Food Security

Strengthening agricultural sovereignty through regenerative practices, improved soil health, reduced dependence on imported inputs and transparent supply chains.

Priority areas include:

- Coffee, cocoa and agricultural exports.
 - EUDR compliance and digital traceability.
 - Sustainable productivity in rural territories.

Water Security

Applying Israeli expertise in water efficiency, smart irrigation, watershed management and climate adaptation to Colombia's diverse but vulnerable water systems.

The objective:

Transform water from a vulnerability into a strategic asset.



Energy Security

Deploying decentralized and resilient energy solutions for rural and remote zones (ZNI), including:

- Biomass valorization.
- Waste-to-energy solutions.
- ORC-based distributed generation.
- Solar and hybrid micro-grids.

The goal is greater territorial autonomy and reduced dependence on fossil fuels.



Digital Security

Building resilience through:

- Cybersecurity.
 - Critical infrastructure protection.
 - Agricultural data systems.
 - AI-supported decision-making.
 - Digital monitoring and transparency platforms.

3. TERRITORIAL RESILIENCE: A NEW MODEL FOR COLOMBIA

Colombia faces a historic opportunity: transforming territories affected by isolation, poverty and conflict into productive, connected and resilient regions.

The Colombia-Israel framework proposes a new approach:

From vulnerable territories to strategic territories.

Starting with regions such as Planadas, Tolima, the model seeks to demonstrate how technology, agriculture, environmental restoration and community development can work together.

Israeli experience in resilience, resource optimization and adaptation in complex environments offers valuable lessons for this transformation.



4. A REPLICABLE MODEL FOR LATIN AMERICA

This initiative is designed not as a single project, but as a scalable cooperation platform.

The Colombian territorial model can become a reference for other regions across Latin America facing similar challenges:

- Climate adaptation.
- Rural development.
- Food sovereignty.
- Water stress.
- Energy transition.
- Digital transformation.

Why it matters for Israel

- Positions Israel as a strategic partner in Latin America's climate and technology transition.
- Creates opportunities to demonstrate Israeli solutions in complex tropical environments.
- Expands cooperation with a country of strategic importance in the Americas.
- Strengthens economic, technological and diplomatic ties.

 - Creates new economic opportunities and skilled employment.
